

Each month, a Ministry of the parish is highlighted. For April, we will reflect on Lent and how Lay Ministry can spring us to new life during the Easter season

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

God says not to remember the events from long ago, but to focus on the things he plans to do next. He also claims he will again help his chosen people when they need him.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:8-14

Paul describes knowledge of Jesus as more important than knowledge of the Old Law. He wishes to share in the power of Jesus' resurrection, and speaks of concentrating on the finish line of the race with salvation as the prize to be won.

Gospel: John 8:1-11

Jesus preached forgiveness of sin, but in the old law those accused of adultery were to be stoned. So the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus and brought a woman accused of adultery to him, asking him what he would do to her. Jesus asked that one without sin cast the first stone, and then all of the elders left. Jesus told the woman that he did not condemn her, but warned her to avoid such sin in the future.

Fifth Sunday of Lent April 3, 2022

"I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things, and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him... depending on faith to know him and the power of his resurrection..."

How often we hear the expression 'a win-lose situation.' As we approach the days ahead, we change this equation, for the paschal mystery for us is a win-win reality. The suffering and death of Jesus, leads to His resurrection, and gaining of new life for us. How easy it is for us to forget that the passion and death of Jesus was not just His effort, but it occurred for us, as we read and reflect on Paul's words today.

Today Jesus bends down, writes in the sand. As no one cast the first stone but walked away, may we forgive others and hear Jesus tell us: 'Neither do I condemn you, go and from now on do not sin anymore.' Before Holy Week, get to confession. That's our win-win situation.

Gospel Today Fifth Sunday of Lent | John 8:1-11


The gospel reminds us to think about our own behaviors and not talk about the faults or sins of people in our community.

St. Patrick was a humble man of strong faith and love of God. He began his missionary work (following his early years of slavery) using his knowledge of scripture and his devotion to God. Like Jesus, he taught with love, mercy and forgiveness, not by force. Legend tells us he used a 3 leaf clover to help the people understand the Trinity - three persons; the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit, in one God.
