## The Sunday Good News

Church of Saints Peter & Paul

March 31, 2024



#### EASTER SUNDAY

#### First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter discusses Jesus' life of preaching and healing. Jesus was crucified, then he rose up and was seen by his chosen witnesses. Peter also mentions the importance of all the disciples bearing witness to what they saw, so that many people would believe in Jesus, and have their sins forgiven through him.

#### Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul asserts that we must pay attention to higher realms rather than earthly concerns. Our life is not yet completely known to us, until Christ appears and we are raised to glory in him.

#### Gospel: John 20:1-9

When Mary Magdalene discovered Jesus' tomb was open, she told Simon Peter and another disciple. They ran to the tomb and Peter went inside. He found the burial wrappings on the ground, with the head covering separate from the rest. The other disciple came in and they believed what they saw, although until then they had not understood the Scripture's message of Jesus' resurrection.

"So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while they were with him at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, 'were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures for us?"

There are many post resurrection accounts for us to consider, but the journey on the road to Emmaus involves us. When we come to mass, He is both our host and guest.

Our hearts are awakened as the scriptures speak. Our eyes are opened to His real presence, as we recognize Him in the breaking of the bread. Like the persons on the road, we return to our real word to tell others where and how we met the Lord Jesus.

Heavenly Father, on this Easter day, we are grateful for the gift of your Son, who sacrificed Himself for our sins. Thank you for the love that triumphs over death and the hope Easter brings to our hearts.

As we celebrate your resurrection, we pray for a renewal of faith, hope, and love. May this Easter be a time of spiritual growth and a fresh beginning in our journey with you.
