THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

First Reading: Exodus 34:4b□6, 8□9

The Lord appears to Moses on Mount Sinai and proclaims to him that he Lord is a "merciful God...slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity."

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11 13

Paul exhorts the Corinthians to live in peace and harmony, and for the first time, invokes the Blessed Trinity.

Gospel: John 3:16□18

In this beautiful passage, Jesus tells Nicodemus that God loved his people so much that he "gave his only son." Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that anyone who believes in him will not die but will enjoy life with him for all eternity.

"Thus the Lord passed before him and cried out, 'The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.' Moses at once bowed down to the ground in worship. Then he said, 'If I find favor with you, O Lord, do come along in our company... receive us as your own.'"

We make the sign of the cross, we invoke the name of the Trinity, knowing we are a people of faith. The loving God, the creator, the redeeming Son and the animating Spirit, the one God in three persons.

May we take a moment to meet with Moses and his conversation in response to God's self-revelation. That trinitarian God reveals Himself, speaking of a merciful and gracious One, rich in kindness and fidelity and the absence of anger and wrath.

Today think about those gifts God possesses and showers upon us. I am afraid we fail to know and love that God who like, with Moses, asks us to bow and worship.

As you make the sign of the cross, think about it as your worship of God.

O most Holy Trinity, bless me with the gifts of the Holy Spírít. Please give me wisdom so that I may recogníze the importance of others and keep God central in my lífe. With my voice and my heart, I glorífy You, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. *You are great* and do wonderful things. You alone are my God. All praise and honor and glory are yours now and forever, O most Holy Trinity! Amen

On Sunday, May 14, 2023, the Saints Francis & Clare Progressive Catholic Community reopened the former Saint Mary of Czestochowa Church building in Moosic for worship. The Diocese of Scranton sold the church property in September 2014 during a previous parish consolidation process.

In response to questions that have been received, we wish to remind the faithful that the Progressive Catholic Church is neither affiliated with the Diocese of Scranton nor in communion with the universal Catholic Church.

The faithful of the Diocese of Scranton should not attend Masses nor receive the sacraments provided by the Progressive Catholic Church community. Particularly regarding the sacraments of Confession and Marriage, these celebrations would not only be illicit, but also invalid.

GLORY BE ND ТГ AND TO THE HOLY SPIRIT With this mobile, share the love of God with someone you love. Tape thread to back Here is the LOVE of the Trinity... WOT 6_e Father - Son - Holy Spirit 1 unit, 3 parts!

Color each of the 3 hearts with text --Cut on dotted line (you should have 3 separate hearts).

Turn upside down (back facing up) and nest them together.

Cut a piece of thread 12-18 inches long and **tape** to top back of each heart, starting with the smallest and ending with thread at the top for hanging. In the second reading, Paul calls upon the Trinity to help us live in God's love & peace.
